EMJ Installs 3rd Hautau System

EMJ, a full-line steel service center, has installed its third Hautau CNC tube cutting system, an RC30 model, in its Kansas City facility.

The ISO-certified company handles more than 40,000 sizes, shapes and grades of tubing, pipe and specialty products in carbon and alloy steel, stainless steel, aluminum, bronze, brass and cast iron. First process cutting and sawing (including miter cutting and circular cold sawing) are also offered.

The Kansas City facility, one of 35 centers across North America, serves Kansas, western Missouri, Nebraska and southwest Iowa. It has 17 sales representatives (11 inside and 6 outside).

The third Hautau CNC tube cutoff system was needed to keep up with customer demand and to handle larger tube. It can cut tube up to 3.25" in diameter with 7/8" walls. It can also chamfer the ID and OD edges on both ends. "The third Hautau expands our capacity and allows us more flexibility," noted Brian Crane, general sales manager.

"Combining our 17 saws and two tube lasers we are able to offer a wide variety of first process capacities and capabilities," noted David Baltuska, general manager. "The third Hautau CNC saw will help us meet our customers' needs."

EMJ (Jorgensen Steel and Aluminum) was founded in 1924 and has been in the KC area for over 46 years.

After the tours a dinner was held at the Argosy Hotel where economist Chris




